FALL RETREAT WITH JOYCE HUGHES

This year's Fall retreat at Pecometh will be held Friday, September 27th through Sunday, September 29th. Six meals, Friday dinner through Sunday lunch are included. Joyce Hughes will be teaching a Dimensional Thread Painting workshop (Blue Hummingbird panel) on Friday. Lunch that day will be planned. a pot luck, with participants bringing a dish to share. The remainder of the weekend retreat will be UFO sewing time. Pecometh is located near Centreville, MD, and has wonderful sewing space and comfortable hotel style rooms that can be single or double occupancy. The dining room serves farm to table meals which are delicious. There is plenty of space in the facility to lay out quilts, sit in a quiet location, or take a walk outside.




Registration is now open. Single occupancy rooms are \$475 and double occupancy rooms are \$310. Contact MARIA O'HAVER with any questions and to register. A deposit of \$75 is required upon registering.

EARLY SNAP PEAS

This pattern makes a 12" block.



When I had young children and a garden, one of the earliest pleasures was eating oriental sugar peapods right off the vine. Sweet and crisp, they were a taste of summer glory. In honor of that joy, you can have your own garden of sweet peas forever!

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:


Since this is our fantasy garden, your peas do NOT have to be all green. <smile> Choose two colors that contrast nicely to make your pods - the scrappier the better! Use different scrappy prints for each pea for maximum variety.

PEAS: Cut Five 2.5" squares of light colored and of darker 'peas"
PODS: Cut Two 2.5" squares of 'light' pod print and of 'dark' pod print,
Cut Two 2.5" x 12.5" rectangles of 'light' and of 'dark' pod prints.

ASSEMBLY:

Sew together your pods with peas as shown below.

Be sure to add your name to the front if you'd like to be included in the block drawing; if you prefer to simply participate, add your name on the back of your square.


