

## Mystery Challenge

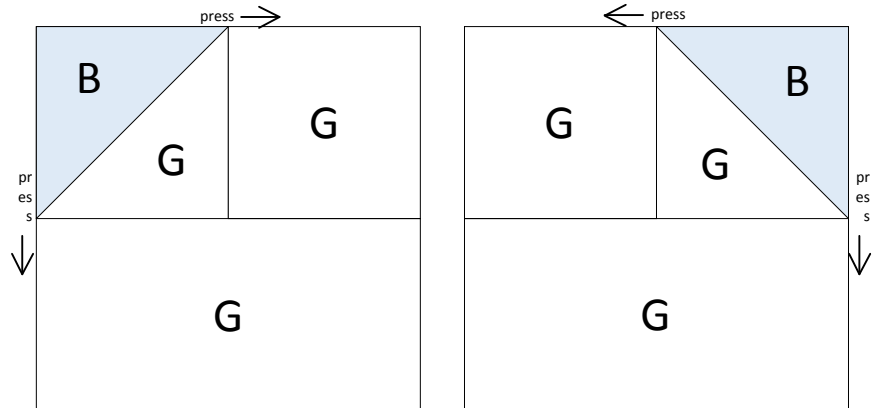
Step 6: Let's finish cutting our fabrics and build additional units.

From our background fabric G some additional squares and rectangles need to be cut. In addition, it is now time to cut into fabric A. The table below gives the number of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric G and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles of fabric G are needed for the various quilt size. It also gives the number of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric A must be cut.

That should complete the cutting required.

Using some of the fabric G squares and rectangles and the remaining  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " HST made from fabrics G and B, assemble the following units:

Note: Orientation matters!



You will make the same number of each of these mirror imaged units (Right and Left).

	Small	Lap	Twin	Large
	44" x 44"	44" x 68"	68" x 92"	92" x 92"
<b>2 ½" fabric G squares</b>	16	20	28	32
<b>4 ½" x 2 ½" fabric G rectangles</b>	16	20	28	32
<b>4 ½" fabric A squares</b>	5	8	18	25
<b>Right Unit</b>	8	10	14	16
<b>Left Unit</b>	8	10	14	16

With this step, you should have used all of your HST and all of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of fabric G. If you have any questions, just let me know!
