VIRTUAL WORKSHOP WITH PHYLLIS CULLEN

Join your FCQ friends for a fun virtual workshop from the comfort of your own sewing space. We will have a live virtual workshop with Phyllis in two parts. Part I is on Saturday January 30, 2021 from 2pm - 5pm and Part II is on Saturday February 6, 2021 from 2pm - 5pm. The cost for both is \$30.

Use one of Phyllis' stained-glass patterns or create your own. You will then make a raw-edge fusible, appliquéd and quilted piece that not only looks like real stained glass but requires no fussy edge treatments, no bias tape, no fussy quilting, and is quick, easy, and fun!

Then we add some optional oil stick painting, and optional applique, or optional embellishment, and quilt either free motion or walking foot. This class is appropriate for beginners, who will learn basic free-motion quilting as well. Full handout and supply list will be emailed to registered participants well in advance, as well as the pattern of their choice from these shown or one from my website gallery.


At our regular 11:00am meeting on February 25, 2021 we will be welcoming Hollis Chatelain virtually, for a one hour lecture.

Hollis Chatelain is an internationally renowned, and award-winning, artist. Through a dynamic and characteristic style marked by dreamlike imagery, elaborate use of color, and intricate thread detail, Hollis creates unique compositions that address challenging social, environmental, and political themes. Her work is found in public and private collections all around the world.

Leaving the USA with the Peace Corps, just after college, and living 12 years in West Africa has had a major impact on her artwork. JANUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH



Cross Plus

drafted by Linda Schiffer
makes a 10" block

This block was first published in 1938 by 'Nancy Cabot'. As you can see, it has a lot of movement and some potential for colorplay. Made from bright, happy florals, it should keep your gardens blooming even in the grayest winter.

Cutting Instructions:

Choose floral prints in the four values shown in the diagram.

A: From darkest background print: Cut four (4) 4.5" squares

B: From medium print at center: Cut five (5) 2.5" squares

C: From light-medium at corners: Cut eight (8) 2.5" squares

D: From lightest print: Cut four (4) 2.5" squares

Sewing Instructions:

1. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Print C square. Sew these on opposite sides of each Print A square as shown. Trim seams and press blocks.

2. Layout fabric pieces as shown in diagram above. Be sure to check directionality of Print A units.

3. Sew together fabric pieces as shown. Block should measure 10.5" square with raw edges (10" finished).

Mail finished blocks to me (see guild directory for address) or put in guild box at the church. I will show the blocks and draw for the winner at the last Zoom meeting in February. I will take responsibility for delivering the blocks won.


